

Northwest San Pedro Neighborhood Council August 29, 2009 Board Retreat Notes Port O'Call Restaurant, San Pedro, 8:30am-2:30pm

4. Four Player Model:

Deanna described the Four Player Model which relates to the way board members (or members of a team in general) interact:

- a. **Move:** Sovereign (Inspire) Person with Vision, (Negative side is that they can sometimes become a Dictator) WITHOUT MOVERS THERE WOULD BE NO DIRECTION. (Speak your true voice and encourage others to do the same.)
- b. **Oppose:** Role is to provide correction (Warrior), coming from a place of respect. (Voice of Reason) WITHOUT OPPOSERS THERE WOULD BE NO CORRECTION (Challenge what's said. Question its Validity)
- c. **Follow:** The Lover (Supporter, Nurturer, help make the "Move" happen). When they are doing a good job they ask lots of questions to clarify the Move. Provide support. WITHOUT FOLLOWERS THERE WOULD BE NO COMPLETION. (Complete what's said, help others, clarify your thoughts, and support what's happening).
- d. **Bystand:** Rarely say anything but provide insight and sometimes come up with the breakthrough idea. WITHOUT BYSTANDERS THERE WOULD BE NO PERSPECTIVE (Actively notice what's going on and provide perspective on what's happening).
- e. All positions equally important. Ultimate Goal is Cohesion and Balance.

- iv. **Success Factors:** More people visit the website, increased attendance at events, increase number of people involved. Advanced notification
- v. Challenges: Competing roles, not enough members,
