Discussed the Sampson Way / Harbor Boulevard roadway improvement project and future community funding. That project received \$8.7M in funding from Metro so our committee discussed following up to ensure that any grant monies provided to community projects is not included in the total spent agreed to by the Port. A review of the funding and spending on community projects shows the Port is pretty much on track with what was projected. Our committee is still looking ahead to future projects that might of interest to the community once the initial community projects are completed. Committee discussed asking the Port if a traffic officer could be assigned to the Sampson Way intersection on weekends and holidays to help with traffic flow. Committee had some discussions on use of impacted land and how the Port might improve those properties, Former Westways and petroleum tank farm near base of 22nd Street.

3. Discussion of Clean Air Action Plan

Had short discussion on the status of the Clean Air Action Plan update. Committee discussed zero and near zero equipment and potential impacts on Port development and jobs. At this point the Port is working on the Clean Air Action Plan and past comments were generated by the NC Sustainability Committee.

4. Port of Los Angeles Risk Management Plan

Discussed draft letter to Port of Los Angeles regarding hazardous materials transport. Committee discussed the transport of butane and propane along the Gaffey Street track and that the Port should assess this activity in their Risk Management Plan. As part of discussions with the Port the NC and Committee has asked for clarification regarding transport of hazardous materials across the Port. The Committee decided to ask the Port to evaluate the transport of butane and propane along the Gaffey rail track due the it's location and predictability. The committee made recommendations to the draft letter and recommend the letter be considered by the Board at the next meeting.

5. Public Comment on items not on the agenda

Short discussion on Alta Sea and Ports of Call Development. Committee is concerned that the Port's of Call development is lagging. Carlos Garcia has been trying to engage the developer and have them come to a NC meeting to discuss the project. Will follow up again next month.
